Project Description

Fort Myer Construction was a subcontractor to Capitol Paving for this IDIQ contract. Scope of work included resurfacing existing roadways on DC's major roads, historic locations, and residential areas including, RFK stadium, New York Avenue, Connecticut Avenue and various DC residential streets.

Fort Myer's pavement restoration responsibilities included milling and asphalt paving, deep patching, and patching on streets as directed by Capitol Paving through task orders. Work was requested on an on-going basis and work was normally completed within a 2 week span.

Project Significance

Fort Myer Construction confronted many restrictions including time limitations and massive traffic management.
